Operational Instructions

Angle Frame Single Door

Closed Position:

In this position, the door is closed in the opening, the lever is level, and the door can be opened. The door does not have any secondary latching initiated.



Open Position:

In this position, the door is open, and the cellar is accessible. The lever is level, the latch bolt is extended, and the shoot bolts are retracted.



To Open the Door:

From the Closed Position, press down on the lever to retract the latch bolt and pull or push the door to move it out of the closed position.



To Close the Door:

From the Open Position, press down on the lever to retract the latch bolt and pull or push the door to move it into the closed position.




How to Initiate the Shoot bolts:

In the closed and latched position, lift the handle to a 45 degree and then release the handle. The handle will naturally fall back to level position.



How to Lock the Door:

From the Closed Position, once the shoot bolts have been activated, lock the door by inserting your key and rotating to the left. The key can be removed by rotating back to the center and pulling the key back towards yourself.



Quick Tip: The shoot bolt mechanism is designed as a level of security between the latch bolt and the keyed lock. They are not designed to be inactivated while the door is locked, and the keyed lock is not designed to be locked while the shoot bolts are retracted.

How to Unlock the Door:

From the Locked position, insert the key for the door and rotate to the right.

How to inactivate the Shoot Bolts:

When the door is in the closed position but is not locked using the keyed lock, inactivate the shoot bolts by pushing down on the handle similarly to opening the door. The door will naturally open as the latch bolt will also disengage.
